APPLICATION FORM (SOLO SINGERS – specialist or part-time)

Please use this form to apply to take part in solo and one-to-a-part singing in tutor-led sessions. If you are also an instrumentalist then please complete the instrumental section at the bottom of this form.

Please send this form to admin@baroqueweek.uk or Baroque Week, 118 Wise Lane, East Knoyle, Salisbury, Wiltshire SP3 6AB. **We will request a deposit of £100 per person** to secure your place as soon as we confirm that you have been accepted. The balance of fees is due by 1st June 2026. **All applications received by 5pm on Monday 1st December 2025 will have an equal chance of acceptance – there is no advantage gained by applying earlier.** Later applications for any remaining places on the course will be considered in order of receipt. We may have to make selections on the basis on the information on your application form and/or the balance of instruments or voices, and if necessary lots will be drawn to allocate places and/or en-suite bedrooms. Some places may need to be reserved for particular instruments/voices even if the course is otherwise full. You must be over 18 years old on the start date of the course.

The deposit is non-refundable unless we are unable to offer you a place on the course. If you have to withdraw before 1st June we will refund any additional fees paid. If you withdraw between 1st June and 26th July we can give a refund (apart from the deposit) only if we are able to replace you with a suitable alternative participant. After this date we are unable to make refunds in any circumstances, so we strongly recommend that you take out your own insurance. The organisers cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to personal property.

The fee for 2026 is £930; the non-resident rate is £690 (including all meals except breakfast) for those who live locally or prefer to find their own B&B. **Non-participant partners** are welcome to share your room **at a cost of £495** for accommodation and meals. Those who bring a harpsichord or spinet and tune it daily receive a £75 discount. Up to ten part or full bursaries are available for those who cannot otherwise afford the full cost – see www.baroqueweek.uk/bursaries

Despite increases in costs, we have avoided raising the course fees more than necessary. Consequently your fee now covers just the basic costs of board, accommodation, tutors' remuneration, and administration. Separately and in addition, we ask participants (all those who feel able) to make a **further voluntary contribution of at least £50** towards the cost of bursaries and the hire of extra keyboard instruments. Splitting this element helps us to continue to offer places to the bursary students who add so much to Baroque Week and, importantly, if you are a UK taxpayer this enables us to claim further substantial Gift Aid support from the government. Making a donation also qualifies you for Membership of the Baroque Week charity until the following 30th September.

The course is principally for solo singers and for players of baroque instruments at A=415, although there may be some opportunities to sing or play at A=440 or A=392. Please note that the emphasis of the course is on Chamber Music. Playing and singing is mostly one-to-a-part and you should be a competent sight-reader and able to hold a part confidently in a small ensemble. A reasonably high level of musical ability and technical competence is needed in order to benefit from detailed coaching in stylistic matters even when sight-reading. Although we will let you know about as much music as we can in advance, there will inevitably be a considerable amount of sight-reading involved in this course, as we usually explore different repertoire in nearly every session. Applicants need to indicate an appropriate level of skill and experience to ensure that the course is suitable for them. If you have attended in 2021 or later we will take into account your ability shown on that course. If you feel that your skills have developed since you last attended, please provide information/evidence.

Expectations for singers at Baroque Week:

1. Specialist Singers

We can accept a maximum of 10 specialist singers – normally SSSSAATTBB: we need to be able to form coherent ensembles.

Session 1 each day: You will be singing in a chamber choir; any short solos will usually be allocated in advance.

Session 2: You will be singing in a one-to-a-part ensemble (or possibly solo) with basso continuo and possibly other instruments, with repertoire allocated in advance. You will also have an opportunity to sing in a vocal masterclass on one day.

Session 3 (untutored) or free time: You can arrange your own activities but we encourage you to rest your voice.

Session 4 - Chamber Music: One or more singers with instrumentalists – your chance to sing cantatas, arias or motets of your choice (or you can play instead in some sessions).

After dinner: You are expected to take part in the all-comers evening choir; any short solos will usually be allocated in advance.

2. Part-time singers – instrumentalists who also want to do some solo/one to a part singing in tutor-led sessions (use this form). We can only accept a limited number in order to form coherent ensembles, so please apply as soon as possible.

Session 1: As for specialist singers, or if you prefer you can play in an instrumental ensemble.

Session 2: We will include you in one-to-a-part ensembles on at least one day.

Sessions 3/4: As for specialist singers, or you can play in an instrumental group.

After dinner: You can choose to take part in the all-comers evening choir.

3. Instrumentalists who also sing (please use the instrumentalists' form)

Session 1: You can ask to sing in the chamber choir if you wish; however you are unlikely to be allocated any solos.

Sessions 2 to 4: You can arrange your own chamber groups, in which you can either play, or sing solo with instrumentalists.
